REMARKS

The DC8-63F aircraft registration number 4R EXJ, owned by Fits Aviation (Pvt) Ltd. and operated by Expo Air of Sri Lanka was scheduled for a flight to Banjui with a load of cargo from the JKIA. At about 0143 the DC8 was being towed by Tradewinds from the parking area to the appropriate loading zone Bay 4 determined by the KAA Marshallers. At 0145 the DC8 aircraft while being towed had contact with another aircraft, a DC9 registration number 5Y-UAE packed near F9, damaging the mid-section of its Rudder trim. The DC9 aircraft was scheduled for a flight to Mwanza and Pemba later that morning.

The DC8 right wing tip had a minor dent while the DC9 suffered a substantial damage on the trailing edge of the rudder trim surface with visible tear of the honeycomb structure. The damage was on an area of approximately 1 square foot size. The DC9 was thereafter towed to the African Express facility for the repair work.

No person was reported injured in the incident.

Further investigations in to the events of the incident have been referred to the KCAA Airworthiness in line with the provisions of Annex 13 of the ICAO convention.
