## **REMARKS**

On the morning of 5 August 2015, the Air Accident Investigation Department was notified of a ground incident at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) by the Air Traffic Control (ATC). An Airbus A330-223 of registration B-6547 operated by China Southern Airlines was on its inaugural flight to Nairobi, Kenya, when its port winglet collided with a flood light mast during taxi.

According to the flight crew, the aircraft took off from Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport (CAN) at 1703 hours on 4 August 2015 with two hundred and twenty one persons on board. The flight was uneventful and the aircraft landed on runway 06 JKIA at 0410 hours on 5 August 2015. It was cleared by ATC to exit the runway via taxiway L, taxi straight on taxiway G, before turning into taxiway M. As the aircraft turned into taxiway M, it was escorted by a lead service vehicle (Follow Me) towards the parking bay. There were two marshallers on ground at the time of occurrence – a wing-walker positioned next to a flood light mast on the left of the aircraft taxi path and the other marshaller was at the parking bay. At 0418 hours, as the aircraft initiated a right turn towards parking bay M2, the port winglet impacted the flood light mast resulting to its damage. The aircraft damage was limited to the left winglet and there were no injuries reported.

At the time of the incident, a ceremony had been organized at Terminal 2 of the Airport to welcome China Southern on its maiden flight to Nairobi. Weather conditions that prevailed at the time were reported as good with clear visibility.

The investigation is in progress.
